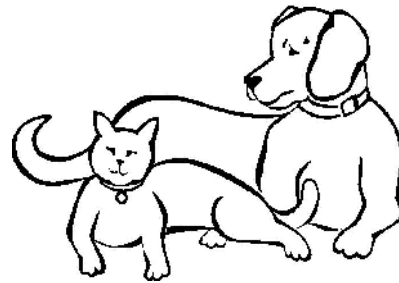

## Chiropractic Care For Dogs & Cats

You may not have already been aware, but chiropractic care can significantly aide in cases ranging anywhere from spinal trauma, to arthritis, to lick granulomas, to (believe it or not!) ear infections.

### What is Chiropractic Care?

Chiropractic care is a gentle and very specific manual method of treatment (just like you experience at your human chiropractic office). It is not designed to replace conventional veterinary medicine but instead to enhance it. Chiropractic treatment works within the normal anatomical limits there is no ligament overstretching at all of the body, providing an unrestricted exchange of information between the brain and all the body's organs. It focuses on abnormal movements of the spine and the effects these restrictions have on the nervous system and the entire body. By examining each motion unit (especially the spine), areas of decreased mobility are identified, and a very specific thrust is administered to help that unit move more normal.

### Is Chiropractic Care Right For My Pet?

All animals can greatly benefit from chiropractic care, whether they be young or old, healthy or not.

Though it is especially beneficial to pets experiencing/exhibiting any of the following, chiropractic treatment may be exactly what they need:

- Acute neck and back pain
- Limited performance
- Reluctance to; move, climb stairs or jump onto raised areas
- Signs of pain when performing certain movements or being lifted
- Undefined lameness, ambling or slow gait, worn down nails on one or more paws
- Hypersensitivity
- Lick granulomas on legs or paws
- Recurrent ear or anal gland infections
- Altered sitting position
- Only lies down on one side
- Recurrent digestive trouble
- Dripping urine or the inability to hold feces

Chiropractic treatment can also be an outstanding maintenance for working dogs, agility dogs, or dogs competing in other physical activities.
